Virginia

A survey of family caregivers 18 years and older who care for children and adults with complex medical conditions or disabilities

More than 1.5 million (1,559,000) adults in Virginia provide care to a family member or friend with complex medical conditions or disabilities — nearly one quarter (23%) of adults across the state.


Most family caregivers in Virginia care for an adult (98%) — most often a parent (51%). Sixteen percent care for a child with complex medical needs. Most caregivers are married or living with a partner (61%). Over a quarter of caregivers live in a household with income under \$50,000 (28%). Nearly three in ten caregivers (29%) are sandwich generation caregivers who care for an adult while also caring for a child under 18. One in six caregivers live with a disability. Four in ten family caregivers live with their care recipient (43%).


On average, family caregivers are **49 years old** and care for someone **64 years old** in Virginia.


Over half of family caregivers work while also caregiving (57%).

Most family caregivers in Virginia provide care to someone due to a long-term physical condition (61%).





What Family Caregivers Do

Two-thirds of family caregivers in Virginia (65%) assist with at least one activity of daily living (ADL). ADLs are routine tasks that are essential for maintaining personal independence.

All family caregivers help with at least one instrumental activity of daily living (IADL), such as shopping, managing finances, preparing meals, and handling transportation.

6% of family caregivers receive training to help with ADLs, IADLs, or behavioral management.






Four in ten family caregivers (42%) are highintensity caregivers, providing more hours of care weekly and helping with more ADLs and IADLs. **33% of caregivers spend at least 40 hours** a week providing care or provide constant care.





What Family Caregivers Do

Family caregivers in Virginia rely on unpaid or paid (aides, housekeepers) assistance in their network of support.



46% of caregivers have been providing care for three years or longer.


Half of family caregivers (51%) help with medical and nursing tasks.

Family caregivers in Virginia are key in managing health care:

- 71% monitor the severity of their care recipient's condition.
- 61% communicate with health care professionals about their family member's or friend's care.
- 60% advocate for them with health care providers, community services, or government agencies.

While nearly four in ten (37%) family caregivers would find respite care helpful, nearly nine in ten (87%) have never used such services.

Two-thirds of family caregivers (65%) use at least one of the technology solutions asked about in our survey.



One quarter of family caregivers (25%) have been asked by health care providers about care needed for their care recipient, and 13% of caregivers have been asked by such providers about care needed for themselves.





Financial Situation of Family Caregivers

Nearly half of family caregivers (45%) in Virginia have experienced at least one negative financial impact because of their care responsibilities.

Common negative impacts include stopping saving, using up savings, and leaving bills unpaid.


Over one-third of family caregivers (36%) have difficulty getting local affordable services such as delivered meals, transportation, or in-home health services.










Well-Being of Family Caregivers





Nearly three in ten family caregivers experience seven or more days a month of poor physical health. Four in ten caregivers (42%) experience high emotional stress while caregiving. One quarter (26%) have difficulty taking care of their own health while they focus on their care recipient's needs. One-third (32%) feel alone while caregiving.
