Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander Family Caregivers

SUMMARY

Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) family caregivers are more likely to care for multiple care recipients. They frequently engage in activities such as communicating with health care providers, advocating for their care

recipients, and arranging outside services. They more often find coordinating care across health care and service providers to be difficult. AANHPI caregivers are also more likely to find medical tasks challenging.
